Our approach is simple but effective:

volunteers are deployed to high-need schools, serving students at risk of falling behind in reading. The program delivers structured tutoring sessions during the entire school year.

- 3,278 students
- with the help of 1,731 volunteers
- · delivering 42,602 hours of tutoring
- at 161 sites across the country
